



Campus Security Information and Disclosures for Prospective Employees

CAMPUS SECURITY INFORMATION

American InterContinental University System (AIUS) and Colorado Technical University (CTU) and their institutions each prepare Annual Security Reports to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act) and Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act (VAWA). These reports are prepared in cooperation with local law enforcement and campus faculty and staff.

The universities update the campus security policies and campus crime statistics annually. The statistics are posted on the university websites or can be obtained by requesting a paper copy as outlined below. These reports include statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on-campus; in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by the institutions; and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from, the campuses (as applicable). The reports also include institutional policies concerning campus security, such as policies concerning sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, and other matters.
